Mission Statement

The aim of St. Cyprian's Greek Orthodox Primary Academy is to provide its children with primary education of the highest quality in a supportive learning environment through the National Curriculum in the core subjects, enriched by the progressive teaching of the Greek Language and Christian Orthodox Religion. The children will be equipped with the knowledge skills and spirituality to enable them to achieve their full potential and prepare them for successful transition to secondary education and to contribute positively to the challenges of a diverse multicultural society.

The term 'parents' in this policy also refers to carers.

School Uniform

St Cyprian's requires pupils to wear a specified school uniform from entry at Nursery. This requirement is fully endorsed by the Governors in the belief that it emphasises the ethos of the academy, assists in setting a working atmosphere, provides pupils with an identity and enables them to feel proud of being members of the academy. Hewitts of Croydon are suppliers of our uniform which displays the emblem. Ties are available to purchase in the school office. The full uniform list is shown overleaf.

Wearing jewelry including beads around the waist is not permitted except for small stud earrings. We expect haircuts of a reasonable length and evenly cut, avoiding unusual or extreme styles or colours. Long hair should be tied back. Accordingly, closely cropped hair with patterns or lines cut into hair for example are not acceptable.

Pupil non-compliance

Teachers can discipline pupils for breaching the academy's rules on appearance or uniform. This should be carried out in accordance with the academy's published behaviour policy.

The Headteacher, or a person authorised by the Headteacher, may ask a pupil to go home briefly to remedy a breach of the school's rules on appearance or uniform. When making this decision schools need to consider the child's age and vulnerability, the ease and time it will take, and the availability of the child's parents. This is not an exclusion but an authorised absence. However, if the pupil continues to breach uniform rules in such a way as to be sent home to avoid school, or takes longer than is strictly necessary to effect the change, the pupil's absence may be counted as an unauthorised absence. In either case the pupil's parents must be notified and the absence should be recorded. If a school is considering excluding a pupil in response to breaches of uniform policy then this must be in line with the legal requirements for exclusion.
